



Behaviour and Discipline Policy

Aims

Our School aims to create and maintain a happy, secure Christian environment in which adults and children can flourish. We aim to encourage everyone to have a positive attitude towards themselves, other people in the school community and the environment.

All staff and pupils are expected to promote a caring ethos where there is mutual respect, respect for each other's property and good manners at all times. We believe that a community which values caring for each other, courteousness and consideration will support learning, and encourage the development of key relationship skills.

Rewards

Rewards are given to recognise, celebrate and reinforce good behaviour or achievement, and occasionally to change inappropriate behaviours. Children are included in discussions, leading to clear directions as to how they can improve their behaviour, and receive praise from all members of the team when they are successful.

Behaviour scheme

The School uses the Good To Be Green behaviour scheme. We believe that a consistent approach to behaviour management enable us to promote and further enhance our school values. It is really important that we celebrate all the really well behaved pupils that we have and we believe that promoting a positive behaviour scheme called the Good to Be Green scheme, does exactly that.
